## MESSAGE

The 1993 World Congress of the World Federation for Mental Health was held August 23 to 27, in Makuhari, Chiba, Japan. The congress and related events attracted approximately 5,000 participants from 62 countries. We were especially honored by the attendance of His Imperial Highness Prince Takamado at the opening ceremony. The congress successfully heightened public awareness of the significance of mental health, particularly through the Makuhari Declaration adopted at the closing ceremony and the commemorative stamp issued in recognition of the congress.

The main theme of the congress, "Mental Health: Toward the 21st Century—Technology, Culture and Quality of Life," formed the basis for the selection of seventeen varied sub-themes. Each of the sub-themes was elucidated through a keynote speech, keynote symposium, and numerous symposiums, workshops and general lectures; several also featured poster sessions and video presentations. Approximately 1,000 presentations were made, including many highly informative lectures and spirited discussions.

Although we had intended to compile a record of all congress proceedings, this proved to be unfeasible. Alternatively, we decided to publish only the special lectures, keynote speeches and keynote symposiums. Eighty percent of the speeches presented at these events have been compiled in this publication, which is available only in English. The congress program and abstracts, however, are available in both English and Japanese editions.

In conclusion, we would like to express our profound appreciation to the many people whose efforts contributed to a fruitful and successful world congress.

## **A Message from His Imperial Highness Prince Takamado**

I am delighted that the 1993 World Congress of the World Federation for Mental Health is being held here in Japan for the first time. It is, for me, a great honor to have the opportunity to address this opening ceremony and to greet the many participants who have traveled great distances to attend this congress.

I cannot emphasize enough the profound respect I hold for the World Federation for Mental Health, which has, since its founding 45 years ago in London, worked tirelessly to improve mental health around the world and to advocate greater support for the mentally ill.

With the many advances occurring in modern society, great changes are taking place worldwide in our way of life and in our environment. Our social responsibilities are becoming more complex, and the level of stress in our lives is increasing. Unfortunately, these demanding circumstances are causing many individuals to develop mental disorders. Adding to their burden, the mentally ill and their families must, even today, deal with prejudice in their daily lives.

This year, however, following the end of the International Decade for the Handicapped, we can take encouragement from the new direction symbolized by the congress theme, "Mental Health: Toward the 21st Century—Technology, Culture and Quality of Life—." Japan can take pride in being host to this meaningful event, and we are confident that, as a result of this congress, the nations of the world will be encouraged to take further steps toward this worthy goal.

It is my sincere hope that the capable professionals from around the world who have gathered at this prestigious congress will achieve a fruitful outcome through serious and productive discussions. Moreover, I trust that, thanks to this congress, the public will obtain a deeper understanding of mental health, and I am confident that medical care and benefits for the mentally ill will be further improved.

## MAKUHARI DECLARATION

The 1993 World Congress of the World Federation for Mental Health, "Mental Health: Toward the 21st Century - Technology, Culture and Quality of Life," proclaims the value of positive mental health for every human being and the rights of all persons with mental disorders and with disabilities as full citizens of their countries.

As we approach the 21st century, rapid technological and social changes are increasing the stresses in all societies. Empirical studies of stress control and management are more necessary than ever. In much of the world, rapid increases in population, poverty, and the worldwide migration of refugees fleeing conflicts, oppression and natural disasters are major concerns. Improving the quality of human life is a first priority, along with appropriate measures to minimize or prevent mental dysfunctioning.

The international convention on the rights of children, proclaimed by the United Nations, needs to be ratified and implemented by each nation so that the true protection of children's rights can be achieved by the 21st century. With the aging of entire societies, the competencies of elderly people also need to be utilized and their self-esteem expanded, so as to achieve a healthy, active life cycle for older people.

All recipients of mental health services, regardless of gender, age, ethnic group or disorder, must be treated in the same manner as other citizens in need of health care, and their basic human rights and freedoms respected.

The Resolution on "Principles for the Protection of Persons with Mental Illness and for the Improvement of Mental Health Care," adopted on December 17, 1991, by the United Nations General Assembly, provides minimum standards and guidelines to be followed by each nation. Within these principles of human rights and freedoms, informed consent to medical treatment is particularly important.

Persons using mental health services often suffer from social isolation, discrimination and prejudice. Eliminating prejudice and the stigma attached to mental illness, promoting effective and comprehensive mental health services, requires users of these services to participate in their planning, management, and evaluation. This should include families as well as mental health professionals and administrators. The World Federation for Psychiatric Users can play an important role in helping bring this about.

The role of religion and culture in the history and evolution of humankind needs to be further understood in conjunction with the expected development of science and technology and of mental health in the 21st century.

We will continue to strive and work toward a prejudice free society in the 21st century, one in which all people respect the rights and freedoms of others in mutual esteem.

## POSTSCRIPT

The 1993 World Congress of the World Federation for Mental Health was held August 23–27 at Makuhari Messe, the Overseas Vocational Training Centre and the National Institute of Vocational Rehabilitation Centre in Chiba, Japan.

Japan was proud to play host to the 20th World Congress of the World Federation for Mental Health, established in 1948. The congress drew about 5,000 participants from 62 countries, including mental health professionals, users and their families, and the general public. We were pleased by the presentation of a broad range of lectures on approximately 1,000 topics. The congress witnessed productive sessions and spirited discussions of great academic significance that contributed significantly to mutual understanding among the international participants.

The main theme of the conference was “Mental Health: Toward the 21st Century—Technology, Culture and Quality of Life.” The academic program comprised a special program as well as keynote lectures and keynote symposiums under each of the seventeen sub-themes. The general sessions included symposiums, workshops, paper sessions, poster sessions and video sessions. Fifteen to nineteen of these sessions were held concurrently, with simultaneous interpretation provided at thirteen sessions and consecutive interpretation offered at the others. The interpreters won particular praise for their professionalism. Shuttle buses were arranged between the three conference buildings, and all conference events proceeded smoothly.

The papers included in these proceedings have been limited to those of special lectures, keynote lectures and keynote symposiums. We regret, however, that several papers arrived too late for our November publishing deadline and could not be included.

We would like to express our gratitude to the many people whose contributions ensured the fruitful outcome of this world congress.

In the spirit of the Makuhari Declaration, we hope that the efforts of all concerned will help to create a new society built on mutual respect and freedom from prejudice and discrimination.
